John Sullivan was born in 1861 in Dublin into a family where his Father belonged to the Church of Ireland and his mother was a Catholic. He was raised in the Protestant tradition. His father was a barrister, who later became Lord Chancellor of

Ireland. He grew up in a privileged and comfortable family. He attended second level education in Portora Royal School in Enniskillen, and later studied Classics in Trinity College in Dublin. The young John Sullivan loved outdoor activities, spending time walking and cycling. In December 1896, when he was 35 years old, John Sullivan decided to become a Catholic, and was received into the Church in London. In 1900, he entered the Jesuit novitiate in Tullabeg in Co Offaly. He spent some time studying in England, and then came to Milltown Park in Dublin to

study Theology. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1907, and was appointed to the staff

in Clongowes. His holiness was widely recognized and appreciated by the people of Clane. Many people came to him who were in need of healing, and his reputation for this spread. He worked for the poor, the sick and those who were in need, and his intercession seemed to have a wonderful effect on people. He was a man of prayer, who brought great comfort and peace to those who sought him out.

Fr John Sullivan died in Dublin in February 1933, and has been revered by many ever since. He is still loved by people in Clane, Dublin and elsewhere, and there are many accounts of people who have received comfort through his blessing. The Prayer for the beatification of Fr. John

Sullivan has been answered this week. O God, you honour those who honour you. Make sacred the memory of your servant John Sullivan, by granting through his intercession the petition we now make (name the petition) and hastening the day when his name will be numbered among those of your saints. We make our prayer through Christ our Lord. Amen.
