Day of Prayer for Vocations

Our Parish

The word 'parish' comes from a Greek word, paroikia, meaning life as a foreigner, life as an exile, as someone living away from home.

In the New Testament, St Peter writes to a young Christian community to urge them to live a good life-as-foreigners, away from their heavenly home. In our language, St Peter is saying: 'As long as you are parishioners, away from your heavenly home, you need to pay attention to how you are living.'

That might seem to stand things on their head. We think of parish as home - which of course it is. But the Word of God wants us to remember that it's a temporary home, a 'home-from home' while we're on our way to our permanent home.

So, the word 'parish' comes to us from the language of vulnerability, of being away from home, of being on pilgrimage. Yes, this is our place, our home; but equally, it's a place where we continually lean on God, where we look to him.

We remember at prayer this day all students preparing for the priesthood and religious life as they answer the Lord's call to minister to the people of God in this time of change and challenge in the church and world.
